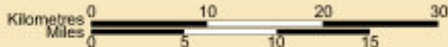

**ICEFIELDS PARKWAY #93**

Speed Limit: 90 km/hr (56 mph)

Ask for the Icefields Parkway brochure.

This road passes through remote, high altitude terrain. Weather and driving conditions can be severe; road closures are not uncommon, especially in winter. There are no services along this route NOVEMBER - MARCH. Chains or all-season radials required in winter.

A Park Pass is required.  
 No commercial trucks allowed.

**BOW VALLEY PARKWAY #1A**

Speed Limit: 60 km/hr (37 mph)

You can access the parkway 5 km west of Banff, at Castle Junction, and at Lake Louise. Watch out for wildlife.

**IN SPRING:**  
 From MARCH 1 to JUNE 25 we ask that you do not travel on the portion of this road marked between 6 PM and 9 AM; use the Trans-Canada Highway instead. Thank you for helping to protect park wildlife. Commercial facilities along the parkway remain open.

**TRANS-CANADA HIGHWAY #1**

Speed Limit: 90 km/hr (56 mph)  
 70 km/hr (43 mph) near Lake Louise

The highway is 4-lane, divided and fenced east of Castle Junction (where #93 heads south), and 2-lane, undivided and unfenced west of Castle Junction.
